The first (or Friday) performance is by the certified instructors from Japan's Kanze School of Noh who are teaching a weeklong (Jan. 27-Feb. 1) at Georgetown College. The Sunday (Feb. 1) recital performance will be by the workshop participants, plus special performances by the instructors at the end. (Noh is a traditional form of Japanese masked theatre that combines music, poetry, dance and narrative. It developed under the patronage of Japan's elite warrior class in the Kyoto region beginning in the mid 14<sup>th</sup> century.) **2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games Competition Schedule Set**

The Games will begin with opening ceremonies on September 25, 2010. The first weekend of competition (September 25-30) will include Reining competition and Endurance. In week two, (October 1-10) will include Jumping, Para-Dressage, Driving and Vaulting competition. The Games will end with closing ceremonies on October 10, 2010.
